<u>State level Consultative Seminar on "Status of Tribal Sub</u> Plan in Tamil Nadu 2015-16"

The State level consultative seminar was organized by State Planning Commission in co-ordination with SOCIAL WATCH-TAMIL NADU, Tribal People's Network, PAALAM, AMBU, TN SC/ST employees welfare association and Central and State Govt. SC/ST employees federation on 04.03.2015 under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chairperson, State Planning Commission at the State Planning Commission. The above seminar was organized in two places simultaneously (A) State Planning Commission, Conference hall and (B) Public Works Department hall.

<u>The following points / suggestions have emerged out of the above</u> <u>discussions:</u>

I. <u>Proactive Tribal Administration by Ms. Sornalatha, Managing</u> Trustee, Adivasi Social Service Educational Trust

- Creation of dedicated Tribal administrative set up in Tamil Nadu since as of now there is only a separate Directorate for Tribal affairs at the State level. Only the district ADW officer looks after Tribal welfare in addition to Scheduled caste welfare resulting the tribal affairs to take up the backmost seat.
- Tribal people need an official at a readily accessible limit and not necessarily at the District Head Quarters.
- District Tribal Officer posts can be created at about 30 places (places were also suggested) at the level equivalent to Thasildar or BDO. All DTO posts should go to qualified tribals only.
- The DTO can function as a holistic or single window agency for all welfare schemes floated by line departments such as OAP / Widower pension (Revenue department), Marriage Assistance (Social Welfare), Ration card (Revenue) Educational scholarships (AD&TW) and Community certificate (RDO).

II. <u>Schemes for Malayalis by Thiru. K.A. Gunasekaran – Chairman,</u> <u>Tribal People's Council</u>

- **Development of Horticulture**: Every Hill station should have extensive horticultural networks directly associated with tribals with the objective of promoting the trade of horticultural produces.
- **Animal Husbandry**: It is required to be put up Panchayat level animal husbandry milk dairy and poultries.
- **Herbal plantations**: In every Hill station there can be herbal plantations set up with a 'Herbal Research institute' since 70 per cent of the tribals use traditional herbal system of medicine.
- **Mini Lorries:** All Forest Rights Committees can be provided with mini Lorries so that the Minor Forest Produces (MFP) could be marketed efficiently.
- **Construction of Godowns:** Air conditioned godowns are necessary at every Panchayats to preserve their products including fruits.
- **Tourism**: Smart cities can be designed with multi shopping complex for vending tribal products.
- **Soil Conservation**: Research Institute is a need of the hour for soil conservation.

- **Educational institution**: A college could be contemplated in a tribal location so that the tribal students will find it easy to reach.
- **The LAMPs**: All LAMPs, (Large Area Multipurpose Co-operative society) in tribal areas can be linked with the **National Scheduled Tribes Finance and Development Corporation** (NSTFDC) and The Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India Limited (TRIFED) which would enable for overall economic upliftment of tribal. This would bring total autonomy among the tribal.

III. <u>Schemes for STs whose population is less than 700 by</u> – Dr. R. Christodas Gandhi I.A.S (Retd)., Former Addl.Chief Secretary, President PAALAM and Dr.K.Krishnan, MD, National Adivasi Solidarity Council

- Special focus on two schemes viz., Housing and Income generating livelihood activities which are the two primary needs of the 13 scheduled tribes whose population is less than 700should be given under TSP.
- The data on Koththar population needs upward correction.
- **Housing** The total population of these 13 tribes is 3043 (subject to correction of Koththar population) constituting to about 600 households.
- **Income generating Livelihood activity (Entrepreneurship)**-Smaller cooperative activities should be planned carefully after indepth discussions with beneficiaries concerned. Instead of individual entrepreneurship in the form of single auto, Taxi, Lorries or vendership, collective franchises can be attempted.

IV. <u>New Schemes desired by Tribals in Tribal Sub Plan by Fr. John</u> <u>Kumar, Director, Social Watch – Tamil Nadu.</u>

Fr.John Kumar made a presentation on the new / innovative schemes to be sanctioned under TSP. He pointed out that funds for general beneficiary schemes should flow only from general heads and not from TSP funds, innovative and modern schemes focusing on material growth should be introduced in TSP and the existing TSP schemes should be revamped.

He presented the following module of innovative schemes:

• Higher Education

Higher education should be made the means for socio-economic up-gradation.Sufficient primary schools had been provided in tribal areas five decades back.

• Focused Horticulture Schemes

Focused horticultural schemes should be extended to landholding Tribals who will constitute not less than 50% of the total population, especially in the hills of Javvadu, Kalrayan, Yelagiri, Chitheri, Kaththiri, Yercaud, Kolli, Bothamalai, Palamalai, Pachchamalai, Aasanoor, Kadambur and Paechipparai.

• Venture Capital Fund

A venture capital fund of the size of Rs.50 crore should be created exclusively for procurement, processing and marketing of Minor Forest Produce (MFP) which has become the exclusive properties of Tribals after the 2006 Act.

• Palaverkadu Irular Aquaculture

The natural catchment backwater where Irulars harvest prawn should be developed with upgraded landscaping without disturbing the ecosystem. A scientific planning should be prepared.

• Thodar Diaries

Buffalo breading still remains a holy and staple livelihood culture of Thodars. They have thousands of acres of Mandhus (grazing land). The 500 families of Thodars could be networked into for running 50 dairy farms to be maintained by 10 families each.

• Irular Tea Factory in Kothagiri

Irular Tribals own about 4000 acres of tea plantation in the surroundings which can support a tea factory.

• Special infrastructure and economic plans for Tribal communities whose population is less than 700 (2011 census)

The total number of 11 such communities is only 1931. A modern housing program with all modern amenities like heater (wherever necessary), kitchen, bath, reading room, mutramand kollai with plinth area of not less than 1500 sq.ft. Should be launched.

• Civil society consultative meetings

An apex level civil society consultation should be conducted twice a year; once 3 months before December and next after the Budget is passed. The preliminary meetings should include:

1. One for Malayalis, who constitute almost 1/3rd of the total ST population

2. Second for Irulars who constitute 1/4th of the total ST population. These two tribes are spread over TN

3. Third for the six tribes in Ooty who are among the 'Most vulnerable tribes'

scheduled by GOI

4. Fourth for tribes whose population is less than 200 each

5. Fifth for Tribes whose population exceeds 200 but not exceeding 700.

6. Sixth for the remaining tribes

V. <u>Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) by Tmt. Neeji</u> Saraswathi & Thiru M. Alwas

- A new scheme of 'Smart House' for the most Vulnerable tribal group have to be implemented with the estimate of Rs.10 Lakhs per house.
- Transportation facilities for the school going children of these tribals.
- Including tribal villages in Nilgiris district into the list of tourist spot to improve the economic conditions of the tribal.
- Each Taluk should have a petrol bunk and it should be managed by the tribal people.
- Diesel motors and pump motors should be provided for agricultural activities.

- Fencing should be constructed the agricultural land.
- Pick up vans should be provided for marketing the agricultural commodities in time.
- Arrangements should be made to make Sheds through SIDCO for selling the tribal craft products.
- Tribal people have been given a platform to put forth our demands in front of the Central Planning Commission. (NITI Ayog).
- Dairy unit should be constructed at the expense of Rs. 10 20 lakhs in Nilgiris district.
- Farmers should be given tractors.
- Construction of tourist cottages and appointment of tribal people to manage and maintain the cottages.
- Permission for the tribal people to manage forest rest house built under HADP scheme.
- Tribal people, who have to undergo CT and MRI scans, have to pay Rs. 1500 to 2000. This should either be made free or reduced by Rs.50 or 100.
- Tribal people to be appointed for the post of Warden in the schools and colleges.
- Appointment of tribals in TNEB and also in Transport department as bus conductors.
- Fallow lands in Kothagiri should be given to the tribal people.
- Forest Rights Act should be implemented immediately.
- More funding from Central Government through Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India Limited (**TRIFED**) should be obtained by the Government.
- Students belonging to tribal community join college, government should take full responsibility of his/her education in terms of tuition fees and hostel fees.
- Similar to NRLM (National Rural Livelihood Mission) schemes there should be NTLM (National Tribal Livelihood Mission) to provide sustainable livelihood to the tribal population in Tamilnadu.
- Provision of Ambulances in tribal areas.
- Provision of Sanitation facilities (individual toilets) in tribal areas.
- Educated tribal graduates should be given government jobs especially in the Department of Forests.
- Non tribal people have constructed houses in the land that belongs to tribals people. But tribal people are not allowed to construct houses there. This problem should be solved at the earliest.

VI. <u>Schemes for the development of Irulars – Thiru. Irulapoo</u> <u>Selvakumar.</u>

- The Akalaivan Schools in Salem district for Tribal students needs
- basic amenities. These Akalaivan schools shall be started in 11 districts where Irulars and Kattunayakkars are thickly populated. The teachers and other employees in these schools have to be primarily tribals.
- Housing Scheme: Among the 32 districts of Tamilnadu there are 11

- districts which have more Irular population. In these 11 districts 100 deserving families can be selected and be provided with housing scheme worth 10/- Lakhs.
- Irulars are experts in brick making, rice seasoning at rice-mills.
- Hence, 100 brick making units which will benefit 200 tribal families can be set up and Government shall buy bricks from these tribal brick making units.
- Irulars are also experts in collecting and seasoning herbal plants.
- Hence, 11 herbal centre at a cost of Rs.5.5 crores (Rs. 50.00 lakhs per center) should be established in 11 districts where the Irular population is high.
- Rice Mill shall be established at a cost of Rs.1.5 crores in Thiruvallur, Vilupuram and Kancheepuram districts.
- The Irular tribal youth should be given free four wheeler training.
- 50 youth with the driving skills and license shall be made a unit and shall be provided call taxis.
- The community certificate for the tribal people should be issued
- manually to avoid misuse of the certificates.
- The LAMP society should be made available in all the districts.
- The effectiveness of implementation of the Tribal welfare schemes should be monitored directly through field visits by the Director, Tribal Welfare Department.
- Irulars do not want to avail the Government's free milch animals or goat scheme.

VII. Forest Rights Act (FRA) 2006 by Thiru. Stanley Murugesan Following demands are enlisted for the proper implementation of FRA 2006 in Tamilnadu:

- The Madras High Court stay Issued on over the implementation of Forest Rights Act must be revisited and reason for the stay and its present status must be communicated to the tribal people.
- The rights envisioned in this Act must be first communicated to the tribal themselves and to the officials concerned for there is lack of information about this Act.
- There should be effective trainings to the forest rights group.
- The administrative personnel concerning this Act should also be formally informed and trained towards the proper implementation of this Act.
- The forest rights group has to be formed from the Gram Sabha and it should comprise of10 men and 5 women tribal representatives as members of this group.

VIII. <u>Schemes that need to be weeded out in TSP by</u> Dr.Paneerselvam, Scientist, IFGTB, Coimbatore

Dr. Paneerselvam made a very detailed scheme by scheme analysis of ongoing TSP schemes which have not brought any change in the lives of Scheduled Tribes (ST) so far. The participants unanimously supported the plea for dropping almost 70 % – 80% of 121 schemes as listed in the Annual Pan Budget Link Book under TSP.
